Answers

Sheet 2 Answers

St. Richard's House: People bathe in the salty waters because it is relaxing and offers relief from muscular aches and pains.

Saltworkers sculpture: The man is looking tired and has taken his shirt off because the work is so hot and heavy.

The Raven Hotel: The timber beams are painted black.

Sheet 3 Answers

Wyche barge mural: The barge is called 'Success'. The sail would have been attached to the barge's tall mast.

Sheet 4 Answers

Priory House: The natural colour of the timbers is brown. The house was restored by the Droitwich Preservation Trust in 1973.

Netherwich Bridge: The present bridge was built in 1936.

Dodderhill: The steep-sided hilltop provided a well-defended site for a fort.

Netherwich Basin: The basin and surrounding parkland are used for recreational activities such as fishing and walking. There are also several picnic tables.

Sheet 5 Answers

Annie's Bridge: The bridge was restored by the Droitwich Canals Trust in 2001.

Upwich Brine Well: The sides of the well are built of timber.

St Richard's Statue: St Richard was Bishop of Chichester from 1245 to 1253. The mosaic near the statue shows St Richard flanked by four characters representing episodes in the history of salt making in Droitwich.

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
