

# Educational Visits Information and Booking Form

There are lots of options for you to enjoy at Standedge Tunnel, you can combine them to create a trip suitable for your class. The following options are on offer:



## Tunnel Trip

The lift trip enables children to experience the lift in action. The glass roofed boat provides the opportunity to see the inside of the tunnel safely, while enjoying a guided commentary. The trip last approximately 30min.

Price: £3 per child in groups over 15 (adults within 1:8 adult child ratio free)



## Exhibition and Film

The exhibition and film give further insight into the building of the tunnel, how it has changed over time and the people tied to its history.

## Standedge Admiral's Trail

A new trail has been developed which can be used in the grounds of the Standedge visitor centre, and is available from [www.wow4water.net](http://www.wow4water.net) along with other resources to further enhance your trip.



## Water: Self led workshop box

Option A: Investigation into the level, movement and flow of water to show how the river shapes and fits into the landscape.

Option B: The impact of the manmade canal could also be compared to the natural water source of the river along with the management and use of the water. There is also a small reservoir on site as an example of water storage.

## Building Structures: Self led workshop box

To investigate different methods of building structures with a focus on tunnels and bridges. Look at the difference between the two and why bridges and tunnels are needed. Why and how was the Standedge Tunnel built?

## Habitats: Self led workshop box

To give children the opportunity to find out more about organisms living in ponds and grassland through first hand enquiry and investigation. Use collection equipment and identification keys to ask and answer questions.

## Local history/ geography: Self led workshop box

To describe the locality and how the environment has changed over a period of time, giving reasons for this and looking at how the area fits into a wider geographical context; with particular emphasis on the impact of the canal and railway.
